### Reporting reminder – quarter 2

For those RTOs opting to submit data to the quarterly National VET Provider Collection, the collection window covering the period January to June 2018 will be open from 1 to 15 August 2018.

Remember: your submission must include all activity for January through June 2018.

### SMS vendor re-registration for AVETMISS release 8.0

With effect from 1 August 2018, NCVER will be removing all references to AVETMISS release 7.0 from the SMS vendor register.

This means that only those SMS vendors who have advised NCVER that their systems are R8 compliant (i.e. those who have completed and returned a new vendor registration form) will remain on the register.

## Notifiable data breaches

The Notifiable Data Breaches (NDB) Scheme was established by the Privacy Amendment (Notifiable Data Breaches) Act 2017 (Cth) (NDB Act), which came into effect on 22 February 2018. The NDB Scheme applies to all government agencies and organisations (including NCVER) that must comply with the Privacy Act 1988 (Cth). The NDB Act requires assessment and mandatory reporting of data breaches that are likely to cause serious harm to the individuals whose information is affected.
