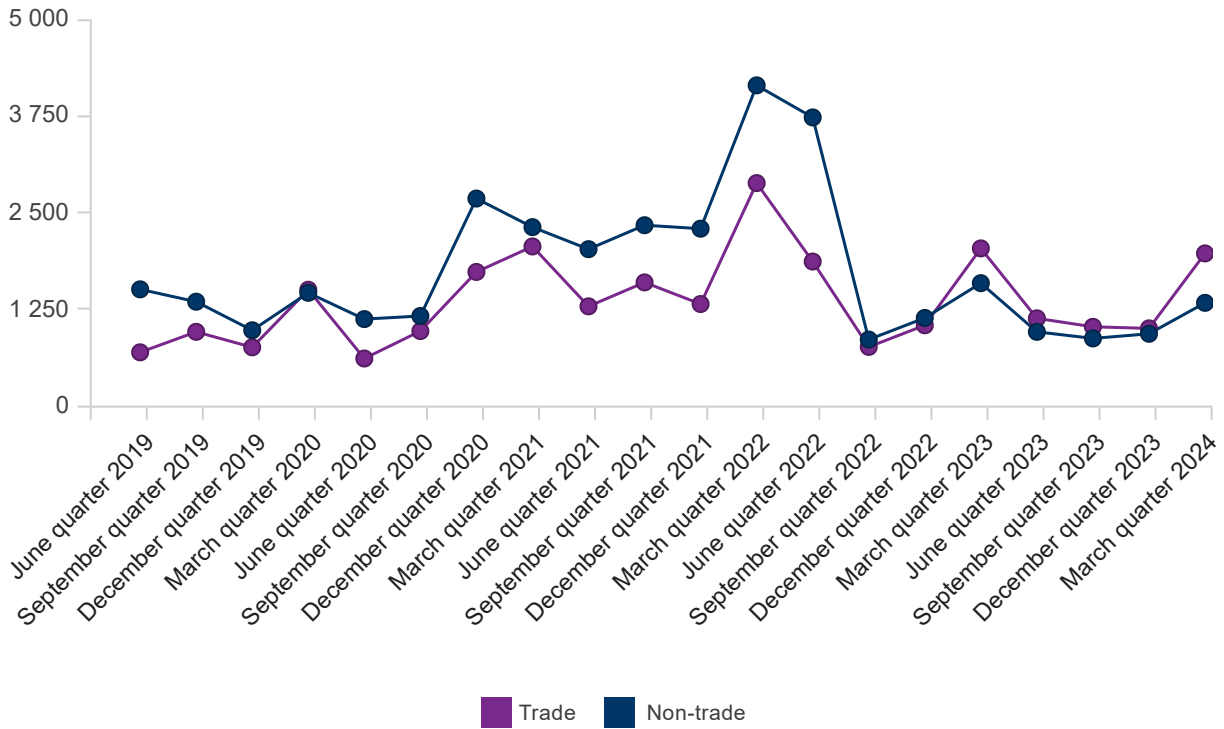

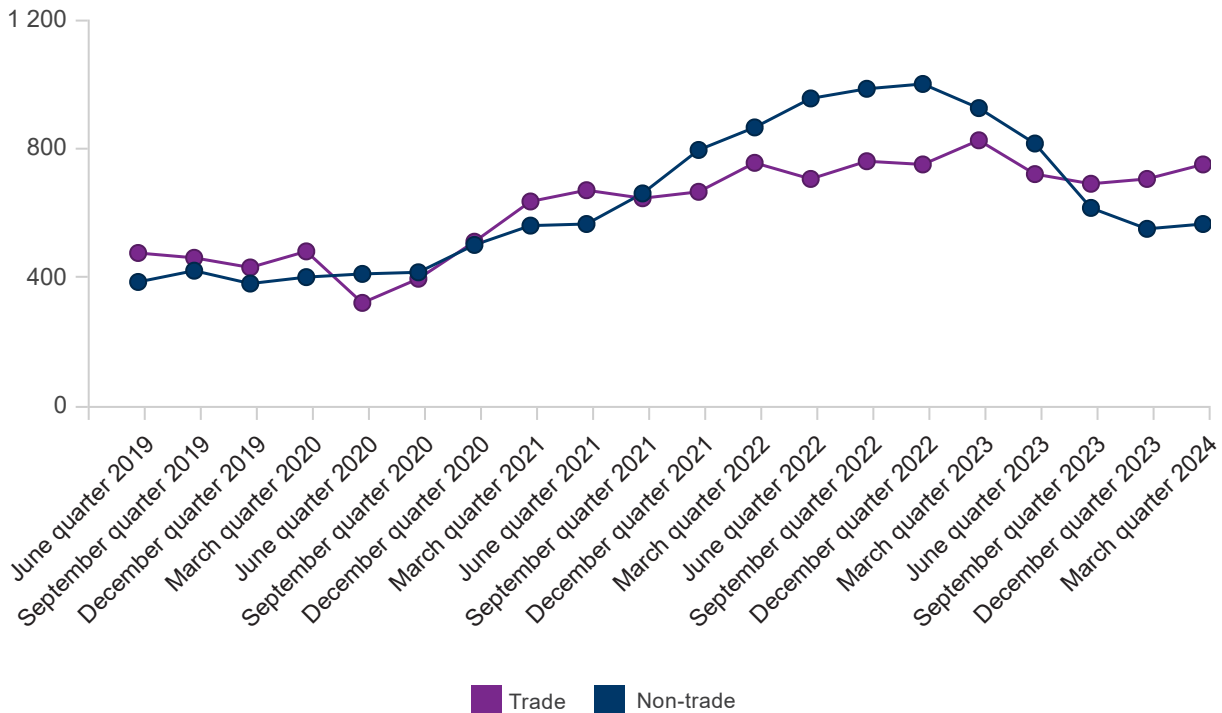

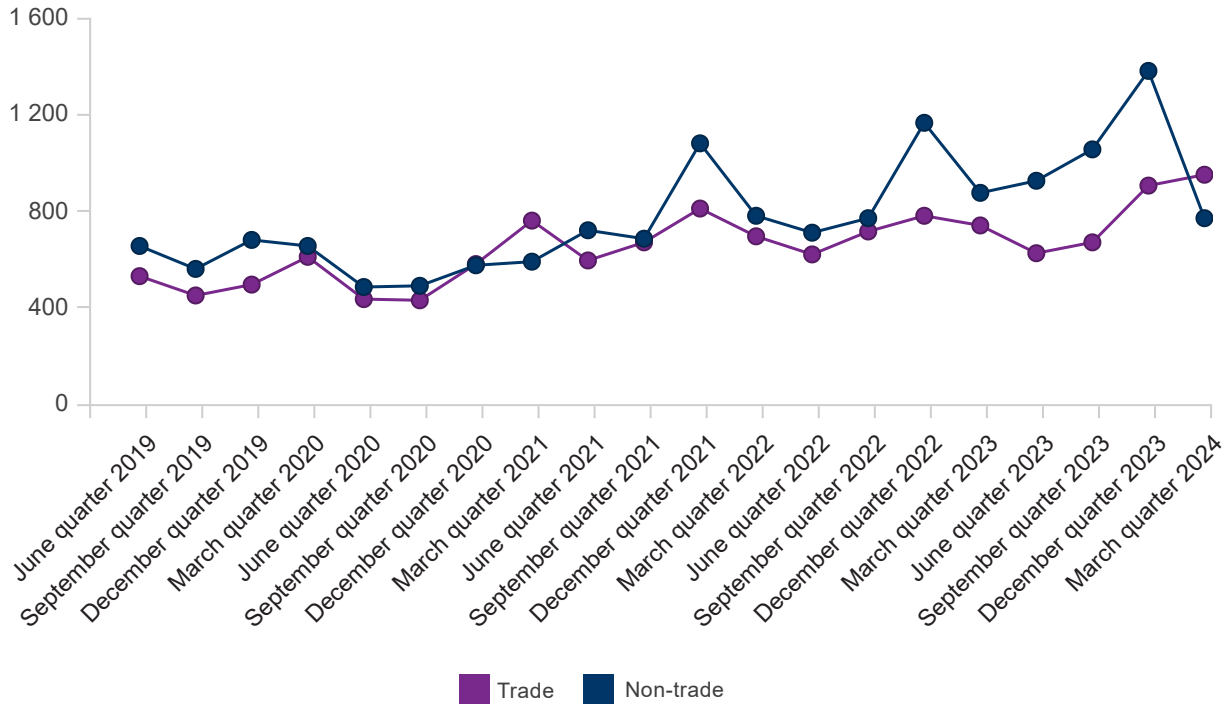

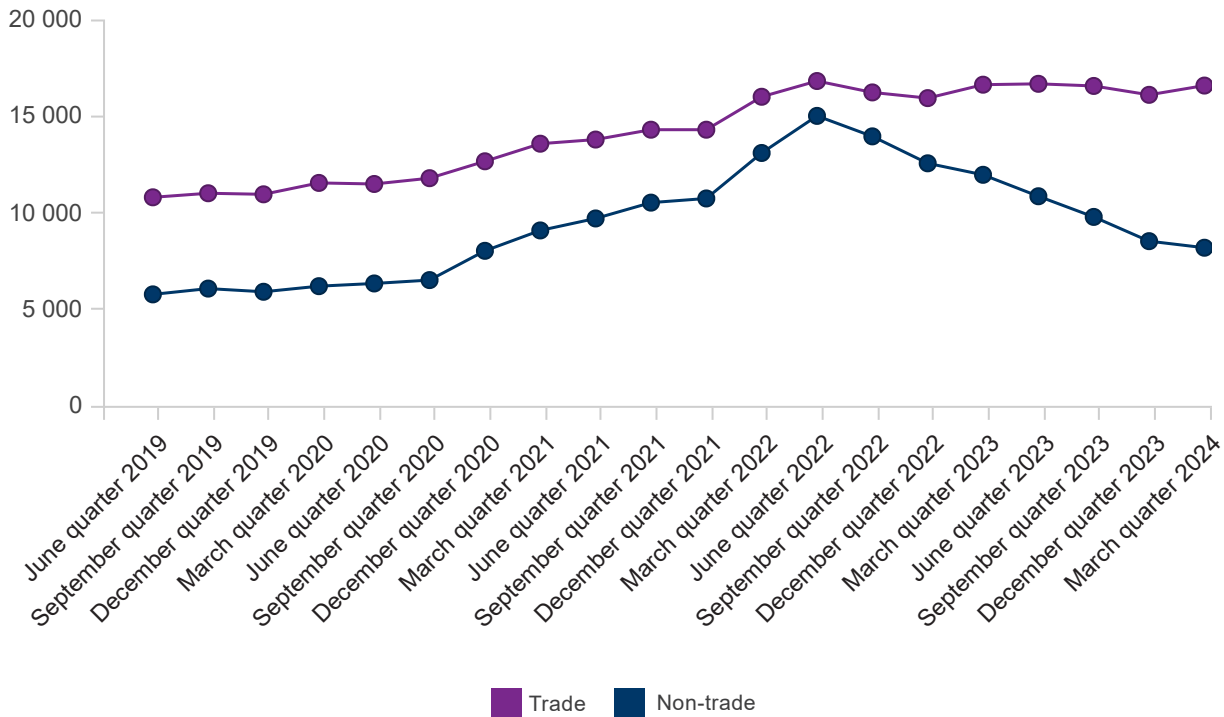

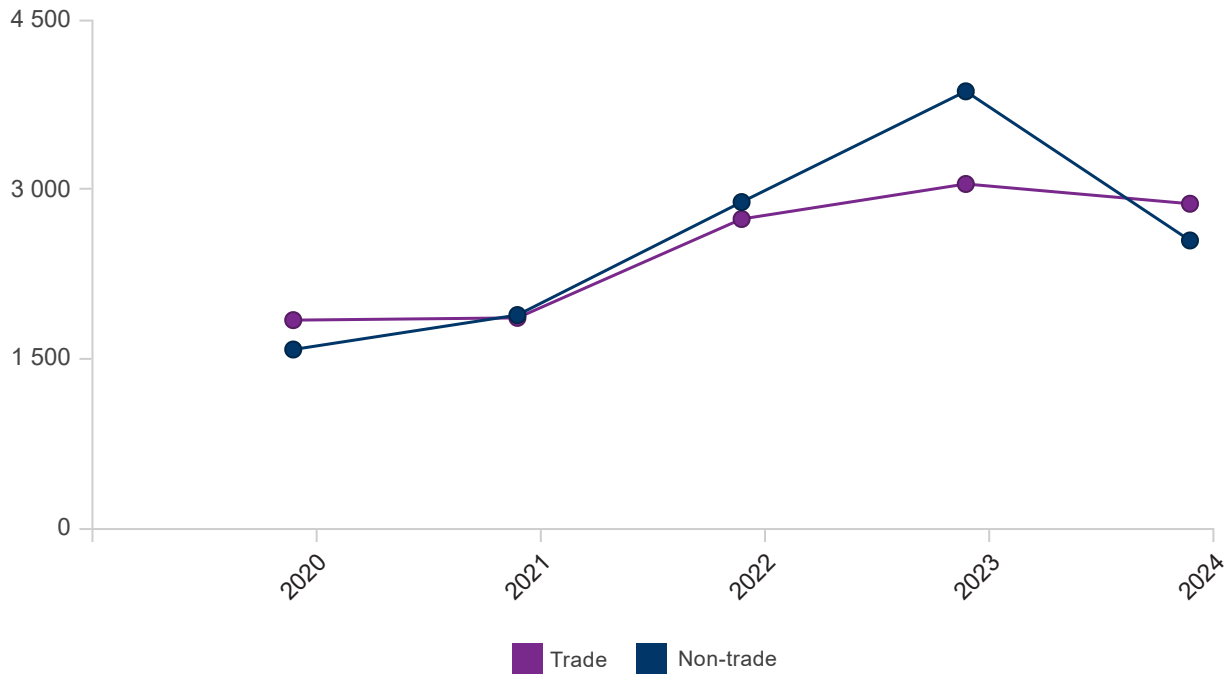

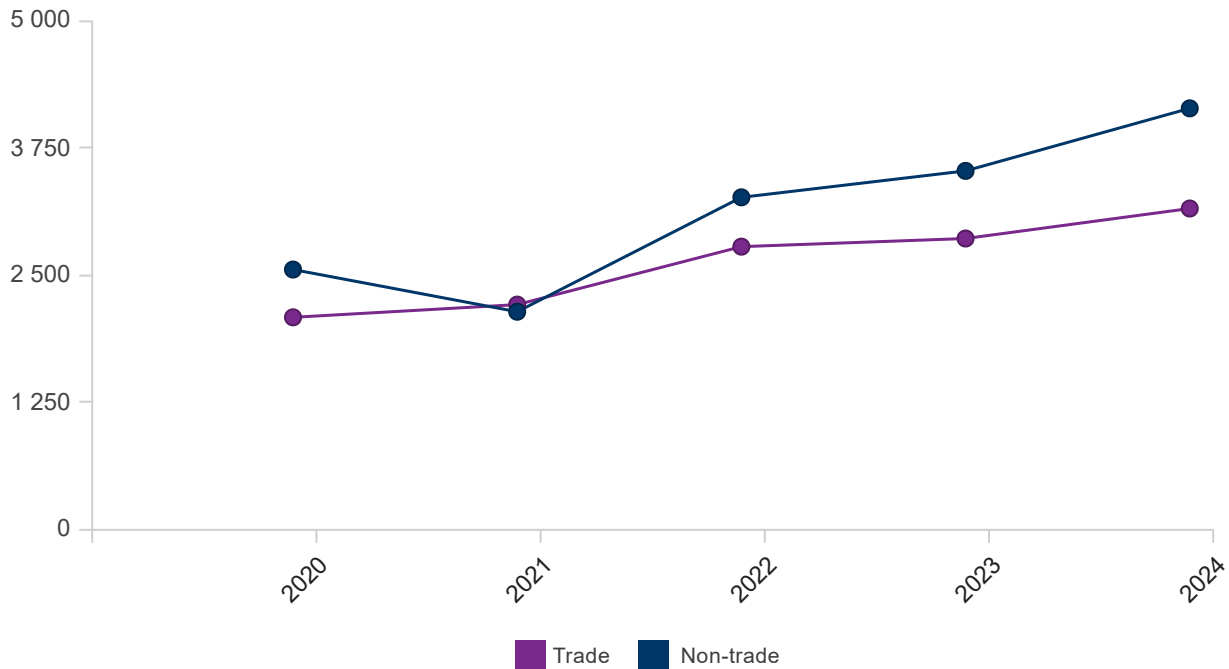

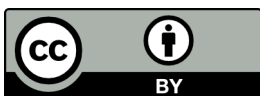

ANZSCO has been back-cast by NCVER to 1994 for reporting purposes.
