# Our work

## Statistics and surveys for a world-class VET sector

NCVER is the custodian for Australia's VET data.

Our national VET data collections and surveys are used to inform and provide insights that can be used to monitor and evaluate VET policy and programs.

### We provide comprehensive data and trends on:

**Total VET students and courses:** detailed picture of all nationally recognised VET delivered by Australian providers, including students and full year training equivalents, provider types, programs and funding sources

**Government-funded students and courses:** summary of data relating to students, programs, subjects and training providers in Australia's government-funded VET system

**VET in Schools:** presents information on the VET undertaken by school students as part of their senior secondary certificate of education

**Apprentices and trainees:** data on persons employed under a training contract, including information on training rates and duration

**Government funding of VET:** how government VET funding is spent and its alignment with training activity

**VET qualification completion rates:** presents completion rates for nationally recognised VET qualifications, namely training package qualifications and accredited qualifications.



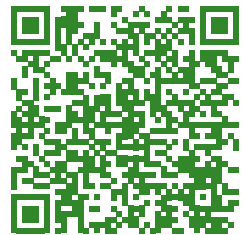
## We administer the following surveys:

**National Student Outcomes Survey:** employment and further study outcomes and satisfaction of students

**Apprentice and trainee outcomes:** provides a snapshot of the outcomes of apprentices and trainees aged 18 years and over who completed an apprenticeship or traineeship. The figures are derived from the National Student Outcomes Survey

**Survey of Employers' use and views of the VET system:** insights into how employers are using the VET system to meet the skill needs of their workforce, as well as their satisfaction

**Longitudinal Surveys of Australian Youth (LSAY):** track young people as they move from school into further study, work, and other destination, helping researchers and policymakers make educated decisions about youth policies.



# Integrated research and advanced analytics to inform VET policy and practice

Our research delivers practical and innovative insights needed to address the key priorities and emerging challenges of the VET sector.

We harness the power of big data and use new data science tools such as machine learning to provide richer evidence-based analyses.

We work with Australian, state and territory governments, training providers, industry bodies, practitioners, and other key stakeholders to identify research areas and ensure that our work is strategic and focused on the needs of the sector.



## Main research themes:

- **VET delivery and practice:** we're evaluating how students are engaging in and benefitting from VET to help improve performance, quality, and accessibility
- **VET student engagement and outcomes:** we're examining how well VET teaching, learning and assessment practices are meeting learners' needs to support continuous improvement
- **Industry and VET:** we're analysing how to better support industry needs and how VET can best deliver skills for work.

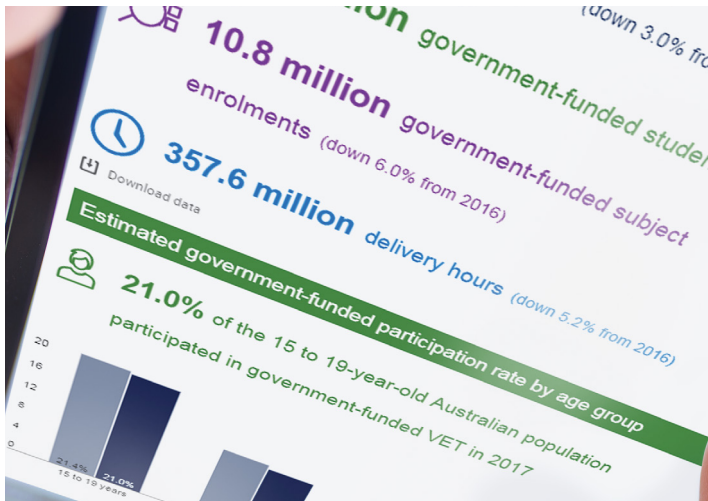

NCVER can provide customised data and statistical services to meet tailored information or research requirements, such as aggregated unpublished data, unit record data, tailored reports and further statistical services.







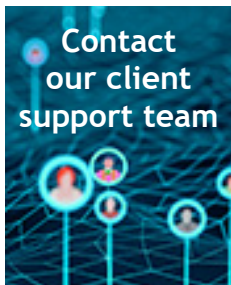
## **Our commitment to data quality and integrity**

NCVER provides registered training organisations, state training authorities and student management system vendors assistance with data submissions. We also deliver data consulting and tailored reports for requesting parties.

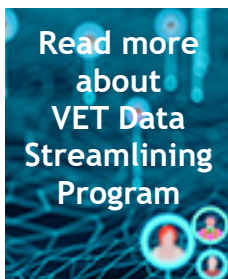
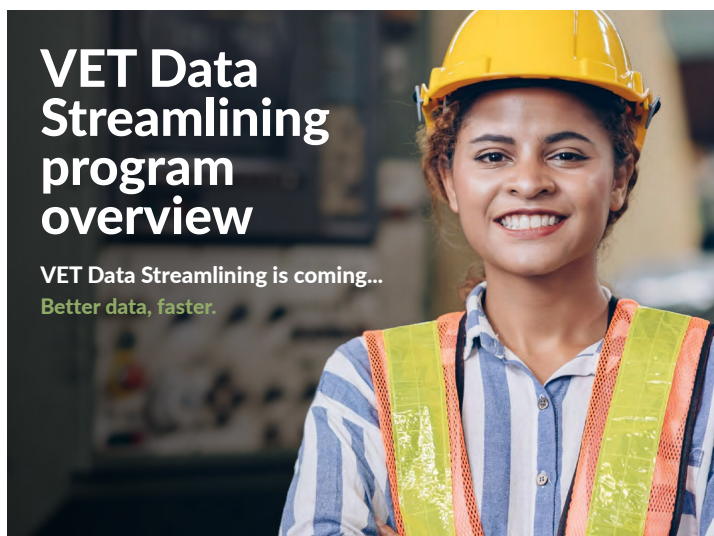


## What is in development? New VET information standard for a world-class VET sector

The new VET Information Standard is being developed in consultation with the Australian, state and territory governments with the aim to support the information needs of Australia's world-class VET sector now and into the future.

As part of the Commonwealth Government's VET Data Streamlining Program, NCVET is leading the development of the new VET Information Standard. The next phase is to test with representative training organisations and student management system developers.

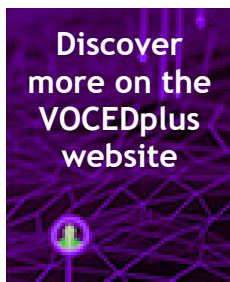
The new VET Information Standard will concurrently run over a transitioning period, eventually replacing the *AVETMISS VET Provider 8.0 Collection Specifications*.

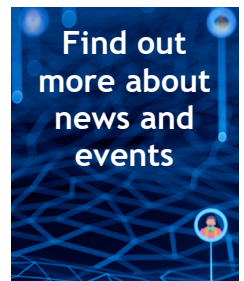
- **VET Knowledge Bank:** provides a complete picture of Australia's complex and diverse VET sector, including an overview, policy timeline, and landmark documents
